

Board Considers NTHS Districts

A decision on areas to be placed in the new North Torrance High School district was postponed Tuesday night by the Torrance School Board.

Board members wanted to ponder whether Seaside and Meadow Park Elementary School areas should be included in the North Torrance High School district.

Apparently definitely to be included in the North Torrance District when the school opens in September, are:

1. All areas north of 190th St.
2. The area between 190th St. and Del Amo Blvd., and between Hawthorne Ave. and the west city limits.
3. All areas north of Torrance Blvd., between Madrona Ave. and the west city limits.

DISTRICTS EQUAL

Figures presented to the board indicated that the inclusion of the Seaside and Meadow Park territory in North Torrance would make the two schools roughly equal in size. Otherwise, Torrance High School would have to resume its "shuttle sessions," held last year.

If these two areas remained at Torrance High School next year, Superintendent J. H. Hull said, they would have to go to North High School in 1956-7 unless Torrance High School resumed double sessions.

A change now might minimize the number of moves an incoming freshman would have to make, he pointed out.

He released figures showing the projected enrollment of the two high schools, with about 300 students from the area in question, shown in two possible plans:

School officials indicated that the matter is complicated because the North Torrance High cafeteria may not be ready by September, and the gymnasium and shower facilities will not be ready for several months after school opens.

Whether the students in question go to Torrance or North Torrance High School, transportation will have to be furnished for them, Dr. Hull said.

Although the areas are, in some cases, closer to THS than NTHS, they must be included in the northern district to equalize enrollment at the two schools, he said.

THIRD HIGH SCHOOL CONSIDERED

Another complicating factor is the possible construction date of South Torrance High School.

Charles A. Mewborn urged that a new high school be built as soon as possible. The board considered possibilities of building at least part of the unit, to be ready by 1957. Projected figures indicate that both high schools may have to resume double sessions in 1957-8 unless more classrooms are made available.

The School Board has set May 10 as the date for a bond election to get funds for the South Torrance High School and other elementary schools needed in the district.

Income Tax Classes Set

Street Work Bid Approved

A contract for the improvement of the south side of 205th St. from Western Ave. to Harvard Blvd. was awarded to McAmis and Baker Construction Co. for \$5505, Councilman John S. Gibson announced Monday.

The bid, 22 per cent below the estimate of city engineers, is for rock and oil paving, concrete curbs, driveways and sidewalks in the one-block area. Work is expected to begin in about three weeks.

At the same time, he announced that bids had been checked for sidewalk construction on Halldale Ave., between 209th and 211th Sts., and for the improvement of Plaza del Armo and 226th St. Contracts will be awarded within 15 days, he said.

The Department of Motor Vehicles urges motorists to speed renewal of auto registrations for '55 by printing or typing name and address on lines of stub at right of new form, as shown by upper arrow, before visiting nearest renewal office. If address is incorrectly printed under name at left, shown by lower arrow, cross it out and print or type corrected address in the box. Then fill in stub with name and correct address. Do not detach stub. Present entire card with fees at renewal offices before midnight Feb. 4, to avoid legal penalties. Do not fold, staple, pin or tear the card. On paying fees, motorist receives one '55 tab for rear plate. The stub will be stamped and detached for display in the vehicle.
