## Rev. Helen Brown Opens Local Church of Christian Abundance

A new non-sectarian church—the Church of Christian Abundance—has moved its headquarters to Torrance, under the leadership of the Rev. Helen Brown, its founder.

Services were held for the first time last Sunday at the Church at 3426 Maricopa Ave. Since its founding, the group has maintained headquarters in Los Angeles, but Rev. Brown said the move was made because Torrance seems to be a "Christian town."

Rev. Brown, a graduate of the College of Divinity, in Indianapolis, Ind., has received religious training with many denominations, and founded the church as a non-sectarian approach to worship of the "one God."

With 50 members at present, the group seeks to aid persons, spiritually. Rev. Brown said, and to aid in the process of self-realization. Personal counseling is offered, and persons of all faiths are aided, and many return to their own faiths after attending the Church of Christian Abundance.

The church uses an approach based on science, both material and spiritual; religion, and philosophy.

### Eternal Life Selected as Sunday Topic

The life-giving healings accomplished by the Master Christian, Jesus, high lights the Lesson-Sermon on "Life" in all Christian Science churches Sunday.

Luke's Gospel (7:13-15) tells that when Jesus saw the son of the widow of Nain, carried out, "he had compassion on her, and said unto her, Weep not.
