

# Chest Campaign Goes Over Top With \$8,653,000

For the second time in three years the Los Angeles area Community Chest campaign which includes the Harbor area, has gone "over the top."

John E. Fishburn Jr., campaign manager, announced Thursday at a meeting at the Statler Hotel that allocations from Associated In-Group Donors (AID) plus late contributions made the Chest total \$8,653,000, slightly more than goal.

More than 800 Chest agency representatives and volunteers attended the "victory" meeting.

"This is another step forward in behalf of the 164 causes in the Chest appeal," said Garner A. Beckett, president of the Chest, but he warned that "this only fulfills the minimum needs of these causes."

"The Community Chest must strive to raise more funds each year to meet the needs of Red Feather hospitals and clinics, veterans service centers, youth organizations, boys homes and other causes, which are facing increased demands for service in this growing Southern California area."

Of the \$465,625 raised during the last campaign in the Associated Cities, the Harbor area under the leadership of Tommy Thompson contributed \$80,000. The overall Los Angeles Area campaign raised more funds than any previous single voluntary fund-raising effort in the history of Los Angeles and it marked the sixth time in 31 years that the Chest has reached its goal.

# MEASLES ON RAMPAGE IN LOCAL AREA

Measles were on the rampage in this area again during the week ending Feb. 19, claiming 60 of the 123 disease victims reported to the County Health Department.

Twenty cases of mumps and 19 cases of chickenpox were also reported. Also reported were mumps with eight victims; scarlet fever, 6; German measles, 4; epilepsy, 2; infectious hepatitis, pneumonia, and tuberculosis, each 1.

Torrance reported six cases of measles, while other cities reported as follows: Manhattan Beach, 25; Redondo Beach, 10; county territory, 6; Gardena, 3; Hermosa Beach, 2; and Palos Verdes, 1.

Other diseases in Torrance were: chickenpox and mumps, each 5; epilepsy and scarlet fever, each 2; and German measles, 1.


