'Zoom' Jobs Offered by U. S. Army

Young men in this area are being advised that there are many openings for a job with lots of "zoom" to it, by Sgt. Robert Yslas, local Army Recruiter.

The job, one of the newest occupations in the Army, is tending the needs of Messrs' Corporal and Nike, the latest guided missiles to be assigned the job of guarding the nation's coast line.

Young men who can qualify are allowed to make application for the special training offered by the Army, and then if accepted, and only then, they may enlist.

After a brief basic training course, the new soldiers are sent to the school of their choice and subsequently assigned to units where their particular knowledge will be utilized.

The training received during a tour of duty such as this is considered almost invaluable in these days of research and development in electronics and guided missiles.
