


**Special Orchid TV Show Set for Sunday**

**Parquet Flooring**  
 Parquet, also known as pattern floors, was first used as early as the 14th Century in Europe, according to the Hardwood Flooring Council of Southern California. Most parquet flooring is of oak, although it also is produced in other species of wood. It is manufactured in short lengths of individual pieces. Customarily tongued and grooved and end-matched, the pieces are laid separately, either by nailing or setting in mastic.

### Spring, Summer Flowers Should Be Planted Now

When winter roars its way out in these next few weeks and spring makes its way in, California gardeners can begin to set in after-frost plants for bright spring and summer color.  
 Good after-frost planters, says the California Association of Nurserymen, are petunias, lobellias, cinerarias and marigolds. These annuals may all be planted now by seed or by plants—both of which your nurseryman will have.  
 The petunia has had an interesting "career" rising from the position of an ordinary summer garden flower to a hybridized favorite in ruffled and double forms. Petunias are fairly drought-resistant and require only deep, thorough waterings and applications of fertilizer, both supplied occasionally. Set petunias in sunny areas containing loose, porous soil.  
 Dependable Flower  
 Often termed the most dependable summer flower, the lobelia is a compact, low-growing blue flower available in many variations. This annual may be had in shades of blue varying from deep blue to ultramarine with foliage in several shades of green. The lobelia requires rich, moist soil and shade.  
 The cineraria is a perennial grown as an annual. It blooms in shades of pink, white, lavender and blue as well as purple, carmine and rose. Plant the cineraria in rich, light soil and water from overhead. Frequent feedings of liquid fertilizer are suggested also.  
 "Robust" is the term used by nurserymen to describe the tall marigolds which are available in several varieties. The dwarf marigold varieties are low and compact, and in shades of yellow, orange and red. This annual feeds heavily and requires rich soil and plenty of water, not from overhead, however.

**Wide Variety Of Peaches Available**  
 "Peachy keen" is an expression common among members of the younger set and if taken literally it would seem to indicate that the Peach is a superlative thing to be used as a measuring stick for other enjoyable things. California home gardeners would certainly agree with this idea for the many Peach varieties grown in gardens throughout the state are very much "peachy keen."  
 Gardeners who wish to grow Peaches, freestones particularly, in this state, have a wide variety of choices, says the California Association of Nurserymen. With horticultural developments there are varieties exactly suited for the many different climatic areas of the state.  
 In Southern California with its mild winters standard Peach varieties do not always produce regularly. So several new Peaches have been developed to answer the need. Robin, a semi-freestone, bears in late May or early June. Springtime, another near-freestone, produces in May. Bobolink can always be depended upon for good bearing in this area of the state as can Altair, a fruiting and flowering tree, which bears in August.  
 Other Specials  
 Other California specials in Peaches are Meadow Lark, Redwing and Golden Blush, which bear in early and middle summer and Flamingo and Curlew, both late-bearing trees.  
 Chosen again and again in the valleys and northern sections of the state are Blazing Gold, Kim Elberta and Gold Dust. Altair, Bobolink and Golden Blush do well in these sections as well as the southern area. Other favorites are Dixie, producing in mid-June; early Elberta, mid-July; Fay Elberta, late July; and Rio Oro Gem, late August.  
 Your nurseryman can provide you with most of these varieties for your garden. Then with relatively simple care your Peach trees will produce delicious fruit for canning and table use in your home.


**3 Area Schools Set For Improvements**

**Strip Flooring**  
 Strip flooring is the most extensively used type of flooring, with practically all species of hardwood produced in this form, according to the Hardwood Flooring Council of Southern California. As the name implies, this type consists of flooring pieces cut in narrow strips. Thicknesses most commonly used in Southern California are half inch and 13-16".

**More Oak Used**  
 Oak is the most extensively used hardwood flooring and constitutes about 80 per cent of the residential flooring in the United States, according to the Hardwood Flooring Council of Southern California. Other hardwoods most commonly used for flooring are maple, beech, birch and pecan.

 Tickets for the showing are being distributed by the hardware store owner.


