Apple Jack will test the efficiency of infantry and support units in mountainous and desert terrain. The simulated use of atomic weapons will be one of the conditions of the exercise.

Sergeant Grigsby, a platoon sergeant in Company H of the 2d Infantry Division's 23d Regiment, entered the Army in August 1952 and completed basic training at Fort Ord, Calif.

He is a holder of the Purple Heart and Bronze Star Medal.
