Adventists Will Dedicate Church

With the final payment made on their building, members of the Seventh Day Adventist Church are making plans for formal dedication of the church on April 30.

Elder Glenn L. Goffar, local pastor, recently presented the check for the balance of the indebtedness to Elder R. B. Bietz, of the Southern California Conference of Seventh-day Adventists. The group purchased the former Lutheran Church, at 1610 Acacia Ave., 16 months ago.

Formal dedication ceremonies will be at 3 p. m., with baptism services also planned. Officiating at the services will be Elder Bietz, Elder Goffar, and R. S. Williams, conference treasurer. Ministers from nearby churches also are expected.

Members of the church put on a number of money raising projects to get funds to pay off the indebtedness. Members also have paid for an organ in the church.

Church members have been participating in a drive for funds for the denomination's annual Missions Appeal, which began April 2. Volunteer solicitors have been visiting Torrance homes in connection with the mission and welfare program sponsored by the church in 198 countries of the world.

Church Aids Needy
According to Elder Goffar, the church spent \$60,000.00 last year in its medical, educational, evangelistic and welfare work.

In Torrance, the Dorcas Society fixed 1500 pieces of clothing, spent \$115 on food baskets and other help for the needy, and made six comforters for the poor. Members also donated six pints of blood to a patient in Harbor General Hospital who was near death, he said.

PROBATION IS TOPIC OF SERMON

Jesus' resurrection pierces the age-old doubt of life after death and records a progressive experience declares the Lesson-Sermon on "Probation after Death" in all Christian Science churches Sunday.

The Golden Text from Hebrews (12:14) reads, "Follow peace with all men, and holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord."

Mark's gospel (16:9,12,14,19) records that "when Jesus was risen early the first day of the week, he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom he had cast the seven devils." Later he appeared to two of his disciples "as they walked, and went into the country."

Afterwards he appeared unto the eleven as they sat at meat. So then after the Lord had spoken unto them, he was received up into heaven, and sat on the right hand of God."

In "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" Mary Baker Eddy affirms, "Our Master fully and finally demonstrated divine Science in his victory over death and the grave. Jesus' deed was for the enlightenment of men and for the salvation of the whole world from sin, sickness, and death" (p. 45).

SALVATION ARMY DRIVE CONTINUES

Salvation Army Red Shield trucks are making collections this week in the annual Torrance Salvage Week campaign, which continues through Saturday.

Castoff articles which the trucks pick up will be reconditioned in workshops of the Salvation Army Social Service Center that serves this area. This provides a social rehabilitation program for needy and handicapped men.

Brigadier William J. Parkins, manager of the center, said the program requires a constant inflow of usable materials such as clothing, shoes, furniture, dishes, mattresses, bed linens, kitchen utensils, home appliances, silverware, stoves, radios, rugs, books and bric-a-brac.

Contributions last year enabled the center to provide 268,550 hours of work therapy, 60,180 meals, and 20,150 lodgings, he said.

Brigadier Parkins urged local residents who have not yet contributed to telephone FA 8-1635 for a Red Shield truck.


