

U. S. Industrial College Visits National Supply


For the third successive year high ranking members of the Industrial College of the Armed Forces visited the Torrance Plant of the National Supply Co. Wednesday, April 27th, as part of a scheduled familiarization program conducted by the Department of Defense.

This program, under direction of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, is carried on the highest educational level within the Department and is designed to prepare carefully selected officers of the Armed Forces for important positions in military service under industrial mobilization. I. C. A. F. members include civilians as well as military personnel, in training for command, staff, procurement and logistic assignments.

It is through the scheduled plant visits that students become familiar with manufacturing processes, developments, techniques and problems with which they could not otherwise become acquainted.

Seventeen members of the I.C.A.F. comprised the 1955 traveling group who climaxed their West Coast tour with observation of the completely integrated manufacturing facilities of The National Supply Company, National's works manager, J. D. Spalding, reviewed plant contributions to World War II and Korean conflict production requirements, with elaboration on status of the Torrance Plant in an emergency industrial mobilization.

National takes special pride in the expressed confidence and approval of its state of preparedness, and in the esteem signified by its repeated selection of the Defense Department for industrial study, Spalding said.
