

### May 30 Last Day to File Vets' Claims

Veterans planning a long Memorial Day week end had better file their tax exemption claims right now, if they have not done so yet. Helen Dill, director of the Veterans Service Center, She pointed out that Monday, May 30, is the deadline for ex-servicemen who have not yet applied for their annual \$1000 property tax exemption with

city and county assessors. "A good idea," added Mrs. Dill, "is to be sure and save the receipt which shows you have filed for your exemption. There have been instances in the state where veterans insisted they had submitted tax exemption claims but the records didn't show it; as a result they had to pay the full tax, since they could not produce re-
