

Torrance Ward Now Included in Redondo Stake of Mormon Church

The Inglewood Stake of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints was divided into two stakes Sunday by Joseph Fielding Smith and LeGrand Richards, of the Council of the Twelve, from Salt Lake City, Utah.

Torrance will be included in the southern half of the stake, which will be known as the Redondo Stake. The Torrance-Gardena Ward house, 1880 W.

220th St., will serve as stake center until a new stake center is built in this area.

L. Lloyd Prestwich of Gardena, will be president of the new stake, with Alfred O. Pardee, of Palos Verdes, as first counselor, and Edwin M. Wheat, former bishop of the Torrance ward, as second counselor. Nelson Reitmeister, of Torrance, will serve as stake clerk.

The Redondo Stake will consist of the wards in Torrance-Gardena, Redondo, Redondo II, Manhattan Beach, Lawndale and Hawthorne.
