

Mayor Poulson Issues Plea For GOP Unity

Fresh from conferences with top Administration officials in the Nation's capital, Los Angeles Mayor Norris Poulson last week issued a plea for party unity in California, in addressing the Los Angeles County Republican Assembly meeting at the Town and Gown of the University of Southern California.

Stating that California may be the key to the 1956 election, Poulson pointed out that the outstanding Republican leaders of California mentioned as presidential possibilities have a tremendous responsibility and that "in some cases it was not being properly exercised." Poulson continued, "There are too many candidates for president and vice president. I am convinced President Eisenhower is going to be the presidential candidate again and that he, and only he, will choose his vice presidential candidate."

Identifying himself as a Taft Republican during his congressional service, the Mayor said he had no axe to grind or any future political considerations in mind in urging the continuation of the present Administration.

In Washington the Mayor met with Presidential Assistant Adams, Vice President Nixon, Senators Knowland and Kuchel and the congressional delegation from Los Angeles County.

Turning to municipal problems, the Mayor said that there was undue hysteria about the possibility of atomic war. He described an off the record briefing to which he had been invited, outlining the responsibility of the Strategic Air Command, and said "we should derive comfort from the fact that every moment of every day we have 15,200 per cent of our heavy bombers in the air, on constant patrol."






