



4 Tracts Given OK by Planners

Four tracts containing 158 lots were recommended to the City Council for approval by the Torrance Planning Commission at its meeting Wednesday night.

Another 906 lots in seven tracts were sent to committee or held over for further action. J. E. Kettler's proposal for 69 lots north of tentative tract 20820 received the approval of the Commission. The tract number is 17988.

Tract 20773, presented by Harry Kissel, containing 50 lots located northwest of 230th and Ocean Ave. also got a green light provided that an ornamental fence is erected along Kent and Galva Aves. and 229th St. is paved to a 30-foot width.

Approval given. Tentative approval was given Tract 19581, presented by the B and A Investment Co., Inc., containing 11 lots at 166th and Cerise Ave. Approval was recommended if drainage problems are settled satisfactorily and a six-foot masonry wall separates the tract from the commercial area on Redondo Beach Blvd.

Tract 20944, which was divided at the request of the Planning Commission, was approved by a 7-2 vote, with Commissioners R. S. Whitcomb and Beverly Smith dissenting. Containing 18 lots, the tract was presented by the Barclay Engineering Co., Inc. and is located southwest of 166th and Arlington Ave. Sent to Committee.

The other half of the original tract, renumbered 21835, was referred to committee. It contains 19 lots. Held over for further study was tract 19308, presented by Norco Knolls, Inc., containing 57 lots located southeast of Plaza del Amo and Border Ave. Also held over for further study was tract 21744, presented by the Barclay Engineering Co. It contains 134 lots between 182nd and 186th St., east of Prairie Ave.

Tract Presented. Northern Properties Co.'s proposal for 45 lots in tract 20445, along the Dominguez Channel east of Arlington Ave. was sent to committee. The proposal of Alamo Homes, Inc. for 562 lots south-

west of Torrance Blvd. and Anza Ave. was also sent to committee. The tract number is 20473. Tract 19517, located southwest of 226th and Ocean Ave. and containing 25 lots, was also referred to committee. It was presented by James H. Mulligan. Also referred to committee was the Maas Holding Co. proposal for 42 lots southwest of Arlington Ave. and the Dominguez Channel, known as tract 18380.

Name Changed Planned
In other action, the Commission recommended the name change of a short portion of street now known as part of Pacific Coast Hwy. to Ave. I to connect with a street of the same name in Redondo Beach.

The application of Dari-King System, Inc. for an addition to Longacre's Mail Shop at 2121 W. Carson St. was held up, pending a check on the legality of such an addition. Chairman J. A. Beasley recommended that the filling station on the corner be removed within six months.

The request of William H. Tolson and Associates for an addition to property at 2109-11 W. 218th St. was recommended for approval.

License Recommended
By a 7-2 vote, the Commission recommended that Arvid E. Wall be granted a business license for a B-1 General Contractor office at 244 Vista del Parque. Commissioners Thirvin Fleetwood and John Mulvihill dissented.

George V. Foutis' request to divide a triangular plot of land at 17126 Prairie Ave. into two parcels was recommended for approval. The Commission postponed for two weeks a decision on a request by Harvey Chapman to divide part of lot 3, tract 11782, and part of lot 49, tract 16132.

Referred to committee was the request of Paul H. Simon to divide part of lot 1, tract 847 into three equal lots of 85 by 106 feet, with a 27-foot easement for a street. Homer I. Rogers' request to
