

## Auto Races, Side Show Set For July 4

While the regular weekly program of Saturday night big cars combined with hotrods, followed by Sunday afternoon CJA Jalopies, is carded this week-end, Gardena Stadium officials today announced plans for a gigantic series of events during the Fourth of July holidays.

Sunday night, July 3, at 8:30, there's a 200-lap NASCAR late model stock car race featuring 1950 through 1955 passenger autos battling it out.

Purse is \$3000 guaranteed. Anyone may enter, according to

NASCAR chief Tony Coldewey, whose phone number is Diamond 7-2232.

The late stocker of this type drew a turnout throng of 10,000. Bill Amick of Portland won and will try for a repeat.

A fireworks show augments the races which open at 8:30 p.m.

On Monday night, July 4, also at 8:30, the schedule calls for NASCAR modified stock car "hardtop" races, another whopping fireworks show and a seven-event thrill show topped by

a balloon ascension and parachute jump.

Featured in the thrill show are the "Suicide Aces" topped by Ben McCracken of San Pedro and Jim Hartsock of Gardena. All sorts of daring ramp jumps, head-on collisions, barrel rolls and other auto stunts are carded.

Ralph Wiggins, Hollywood stunt artist, will perform on a trapeze while his silk nylon balloon soars 3000 ft. up, then he'll parachute back near the stadium.

This Saturday night highlights the CRA Indianapolis-type big cars, many of which are equipped with Offenhauser engines like the 500-mile machines. Races start at 8:30 p.m., after trials at 7.


