MONTEBELLO, CALIFORNIA—Specializing in plastic products, the 90 employees of the All-Power Mfg. Co. produce thousands of spacer bushings for wings and drop tanks of North American planes.

RHINELANDER, WISCONSIN—From the woods of northern Michigan come the logs to be processed by the Atlas Plywood Company, where 240 employees make strong crates for Navy fuel tanks.
