Keystone Area Patrolled Now by Firestone Deputies

Transfer of some of the area formerly patrolled by Lennox Sheriff's Station to jurisdiction of the Firestone Station has been announced by Sheriff E. W. Hiscalluz.

The changes, which went into effect Friday, were made to increase services, and were made possible by budget increases and personnel advances recently voted by the Board of Supervisors.

Now under the Firestone Station are:

1. That area bounded on the north by 120 St., on the east by Main St., on the south by Lomita Blvd., and on the west by the City of Los Angeles boundaries along Normandie Ave. and Figueroa St.
2. That area bounded on the north by 190 St., on the east by a line approximately midway between Normandie Ave. and Rosemead St., on the south by approximately 203 St., and on the west by Normandie Ave.
3. That area on the north by approximately 170 St., on the east by Vermont Ave., on the south by 182 St., and on the west by Danen Ave.
4. That area bounded on the north by 166 St., on the east by Gramercy Place and Western Ave., on the south by 182 St., and on the west by a line just west of Western Ave. and Illinois St.
