Rev. Bello Will Take New Post

The Rev. Arthur E. Bello, Rector of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church for the past six years, will leave Sept. 1 to become dean of boys at St. Francis Boys' Home in Bavaria, Kan., he announced Sunday.

He will be in charge of one unit of an Episcopal home for delinquent boys. Located near Salina, Kan., the home is so designed to rehabilitate through Christian training, boys who have been convicted of crimes. Youths between 10 and 18 are accepted from all denominations. The Bavaria home includes some 25 to 30 boys from all parts of the country.

During his stay in Torrance, Rev. Bello offered much marital and youth counseling and was a former psychiatric case observer in New York City. A native of New York, he graduated from New York University, the Episcopal Theological School at Cambridge, and did graduate work in psychology and counseling at the University of Southern California. He has spent 15 years in the ministry, and has been in Torrance since 1949. His wife and

Adventists Donate to Welfare Aid

Seventh-day Adventists gave welfare aid in the Southland valued at \$244,250 during the first six months of 1955, according to a report released today by George E. Liscombe, Glendale, home missions director of the church.

The report revealed that 20,963 persons have been helped by the aid which was dispensed by 69 organized welfare units of the Adventist church in Los Angeles, Santa Barbara, and Ventura counties.

Church welfare workers gave 789,484 hours of "help work" during the six-month period, according to the report. Health treatments were given to 4130 persons by qualified lay members in addition to treatment given thousands in free clinics operated by Seventh-day Adventist hospitals in the Southland.

Nearly 68,000 articles of clothing were given needy persons by local Adventist welfare units while scores of other persons were aided from the church's main Los Angeles Welfare Center at 3131 Pasadena Ave. A total of 9560 food baskets were given during the half-year period.
