

Symphony Gives Varied Program At Pops Concert

Rodney Norris, of Torrance, vice president of the Beach Cities Symphony Association and first clarinetist of the Beach Cities Symphony Orchestra, has announced the program for the Summer Pops Concert to be held on tomorrow night at 8:15 p.m., in the auditorium of Redondo Union High school.

The program follows: Rossini's Overture to "La Gazza Ladra" first movement of the Concerto in G major for Violin and orchestra, by Mozart, with marimba soloist JoAnn Rosenberg; "Woodland Sketches," by Edward MacDowell; "Valse Lente" and "Pizzicato" from the ballet "Sylvia," of Delibes; "Love Scene," by 19-year-old Redondo composer, Edmundo Najera; "Zigeunerweisen" of Sarasate; with marimba soloist Edward Rosenberg; and the "Peer Gynt" Suite No. 1, by Edvard Grieg.

A one dollar donation is being asked as a means of orchestra fund-raising, children excepted. It is the conviction of Conductor Curtis Stearns that children should have the advantage of hearing good music, whenever and wherever possible.

Torrance contributes a number of players to this fast-growing symphonic group, including, besides Norris, violinists Frances Drews, William Pal, Laurette Chase, Ronald Chase and Medora Scanlon; cellists Shirley Pulver and Kenneth Hinkley; French horn player Robert Stone; and percussionist Gibson Fairman.

With Sept. 16, opening day of the 28th annual Los Angeles County Fair, only a few weeks away, the 450-acre exposition park at Pomona, is a hive of industry as final touches are given to over \$250,000 worth of additions, improvements and furnishings to meet the increased size and scope of this year's exposition.

Major construction now centers about a large, new Mexican Village with its 1000-seat pavilion, and an expandable model home displaying practical new ideas. Artisans are transforming the fine arts building into another home beautiful to the eye and inviting to the touch. In the many other exhibit buildings men are augmenting both and other facilities for a record number of entries in all departments.

Several beautiful feature exhibits are underway in the huge agricultural building. New decorations will add to its appeal. A hundred men are employed in landscaping, and a upkeep to maintain the exposition's reputation as the most beautiful fair in the country. More than a million Petunias and Zenias have been planted to reach the peak of their bloom at fairtime. Another crew is finishing a new playground for youngsters. A special track with bleachers is being built for midget auto races staged by kiddies. The famed miniature train exhibit is receiving a bright new setting.
