NOTICE INVITING BIDS
Notice is hereby given that sealed bids will be received at the office of the Chief Engineer of the Los Angeles County Flood Control District, Room 108, 2250 Alhambra Street, Los Angeles, California, until 1:00 P. M., August 19, 1955, at which time the bids will be opened and read in Room 111 at the above address for the construction of STORM DRAIN BOND CANALS, PROPOSED AT THE HILLO AVENUE STORM DRAIN IN THE CITY OF TORRANCE, CALIFORNIA AND UNIT OF PROJECT NO. 75, 2145 S. T. B. E. T. STORM DRAIN IN THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA, involving approximately 12,000 linear feet 36-inch to 39-inch and 420 linear feet 36-inch to 15-inch reinforced concrete pipe drains, 4200 cubic yards concrete, 170,000 lbs. reinforcing steel and 2,200 barrels portland cement for reinforced concrete box conduit; and miscellaneous apartment work.

Each bid must be accompanied by a certified cashier's check or bid bond in an amount equal to ten (10) percent of the amount of the bid, payable to Los Angeles County Flood Control District as a guarantee that the bidder will, if awarded the contract, enter into a satisfactory agreement within fifteen (15) days after the date of the award of the bid in the amount of at least fifty (50) percent of the amount of the accepted bid for the full performance of the work in accordance with the contract and specifications, and a bond in the amount of fifty (50) percent of the accepted bid to guarantee the payment of the materialmen and laborers. The bidder's bond must be duly executed by the bidder and a financially sound surety company authorized to transact business in this state and whose name is on file with the County Clerk of Los Angeles County as an approved and financially sound surety company.

The bid is reserved to reject any or all bids not suited, in the judgment of the Board of Supervisors, to the best interests of the District.

Further information will be furnished and proposal blanks, drawings, and copies of the specifications may be obtained at the office of the Chief Engineer of Los Angeles County Flood Control District, Room 108, 2250 Alhambra Street, Los Angeles, California, upon payment as follows:

If drawings and specifications are picked up at the District's office, the purchase price is \$2.50 for each set which must be paid at the time the drawings are picked up. Please note that upon payment of the appropriate purchase price the drawings and specifications become the property of the purchaser and are not to be returned to the District for refund.

If the drawings and specifications are requested by mail the purchase price is \$3.61 for each set and the request must be accompanied by a check or money order in full payment for the set or sets desired. Please note that upon payment of the appropriate purchase price the drawings and specifications become the property of the purchaser and are not to be returned to the District for refund.

The above prices include State sales tax.

The successful bidder will be re-

quired to observe all applicable provisions of the Labor Code of the State of California, which provides, among other things, that work may be performed by employees of a contractor in excess of eight (8) hours per day upon payment of compensation for all hours worked in excess of eight (8) hours per day at not less than one and one-half times the basic rate of pay, as authorized by Section 187 of the Labor Code.

The Board of Supervisors of the Los Angeles County Flood Control District has accepted and the successful bidder will be required to pay the general prevailing rate or type of workman or mechanic needed to execute the contract and a schedule of said prevailing rates as incorporated herein as follows, to wit:

APPRENTICES—May be employed in conformity with Section 1777.5 of the California Labor Code.

RIGGERS—Same wage scale as craft to which rigging is incidental.

WELDERS—Same wage scale as craft to which welding is incidental.

FOREMEN—All foremen not herein separately classified shall be paid not less than \$1.00 per day more than the daily rate of the highest classification in which he has supervision in the six Basic Trades and not less than \$1.00 per day more than the journeyman rate for the craft involved in the Sub-

Provided, that overtime rates, rates of pay for Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays shall apply to those holidays as recognized in the collective bargaining agreement applicable to the particular craft, classification or type of workman employed on the project.

Provided that notwithstanding the general provision contained herein, Flagmen, Guards, and Watchmen shall be paid one and one-half times the prevailing rate or overtime (overtime shall be time worked in excess of eight hours per day or forty hours per week), and the straight prevailing rate of time worked on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays where such time does not constitute overtime.

The foregoing prevailing wage schedule is based upon a working day of eight hours and in the event that laborers, workmen, or mechanics are employed less than eight hours per day, the rate of per diem wages shall be deemed to be that fraction of the number of hours of employment bears to eight.

The Contractor shall forfeit ten dollars for each calendar day, or portion thereof, for each workman employed under the contract for any work done under the contract by him or by any sub-contractor under him, as required by Section 1775 of the Labor Code.
