Little League All-Stars Top Compton, 6 to 1

John Mewborn made his first appearance on the mound for the Torrance American Little League All Stars a winning one as he set back Compton, 6-1, Saturday, and gave the Los Angeles District title to the Torrance gang.

Doug Potts had picked up his third play off win on Friday. He pitched the locals to a close, 4-3, victory over Glendale. Both games were settled at Verdugo Park in Glendale.

Manager Bo Pallico's nine qualified for the Western Regional championships at Santa Monica by taking the Glendale and Compton teams into camp. They were the fifth and sixth straight play off wins for Torrance.
