**Blanche Nagy to Attend Editors' European Confab**

Mrs. Blanche Nagy, 1920 Plaza del Amo, twice winner of the Freedom Foundation Award, and editor of the National News, personnel magazine of the Torrance plant of the National Supply Co., will leave Aug. 20 for Europe. Chosen as an outstanding editor, she will represent the

Southern California Assn. of Industrial Editors meeting in Copenhagen. Mrs. Nagy has been in Torrance and with the local firm since 1942. Besides holding membership in the Editors' association, she is a charter member of the Rod and Gun Club.

She will go by plane to Newark, where she will be a guest of an aunt, Mrs. Joe Fromeyer, whom she has not seen in 20 years. From there she goes to New York where she will board a Scandinavian Airliner for Copenhagen. At the convention she will show a film "Make-It-A-Holiday" which will be an invitation to those present to attend the International Convention to be held in Los Angeles in 1956.

Besides her career, Mrs. Nagy is an avid fishing fan and topping her list of "musts" is "to catch one of those tunny fish from the Kattegat." She has caught sail fish in Acapulco, marlin in La Paz and Guaymas and next year hopes to enter the International Marlin derby in Panama.

From Copenhagen she will go to the Netherlands, Belgium, and on to Luxembourg and Heidelberg, then south to Rome, Italy, where she hopes to obtain an audience with the Pope. In Italy she will be the guest of her firm's Italian representative, Italo Veneziano.

She plans to celebrate her birthday in Paris, where she will be the guest of Mr. and Mrs. William B. Young. Mr. Young is National's representative in Paris. Her next stop will be London, England, where she will be entertained again by National's London manager, Richard B. Rogers. After a tour of the British Isles, she will board her plane for home at Glasgow, Scotland.
