

Public Workers' Aides Revealed

Mrs. Bernice Goodwin, public employees chairman for the 1955-56 Community Chest campaign in Torrance, announced last week that James Growth of the Torrance City Garage and Stanley Fogarty of the City Engineer's Office, will serve as committeemen to assist her in Chest solicitations.

Also to aid in the Red Feather campaign among Torrance city employees are the following volunteers: Mrs. Ladeen Chamberlain, City Manager's Office; Mrs. Maxine Herman, Police Department; Mrs. Bernice Florence, Police Department; Mrs. Violet Whittington, Recreation Department; and Mrs. Jean Wren, Fire Department.

In a letter to Torrance city employees, Mrs. Goodwin stated, "We (city employees) are more directly affected by the well-being of our community than is the average resident of our city. . . . We know that anything that helps the City of Torrance helps us."

Babies' and Children's Hospital, Children's Hospital and Orthopaedic Hospital—and 10,920 veterans served by the Torrance Veterans' Service Center.

time. During the training period each will be processed via a set of battery test scores that indicate the trade for which each young man is best qualified.

There are 61 trades or ratings in the Navy that can be further narrowed or broadened into one or more of a 1000 specialties that parallel 4000 or more types of civil work—nearly 20,000 separate jobs are represented, according to Department of Labor statistics, within the Navy.






