It's a Spicy Applesauce Cake For The Holidays Coming Up

A double duty recipe for Apple Sauce Cake in that whole measures can be used if being prepared for a party, or large family group, and half portions can be used if the cake is being made for a smaller number of people. Both recipes turn out well, according to Mrs. J. H. Hull who is sharing her favorite recipe with HERALD readers.

APPLESAUCE CAKE

| 1 cup shortening | ½ tsp. salt |
| 2 cups sugar | 1 tbs. soda |
| 2 eggs | 2½ cups applesauce (unsweetened) |
| 3 cups sifted flour | 2 tbs. corn syrup |
| 1½ tsp. nutmeg | 1 cup raisins |
| 1 tbs. cinnamon | 1 cup chopped nuts |
| 1 tsp. cloves | |

Cream shortening and sugar, adding sugar gradually. Add eggs one at a time, mixing well. Sift dry ingredients together; mix applesauce and corn syrup and add dry ingredients and apple sauce alternately to above, mixing well. Then add raisins and chopped nuts. Bake in large pan 12½ x 9½ inches for 1½ hours at 300 degrees.

This may be served plain, with whipped cream or this delicious caramel sauce:

½ cup milk	½ tsp. vanilla
½ cup water	2 tbs. butter
1 cup brown sugar	1½ tbs. flour
½ tsp. nutmeg	

Place milk and water in saucepan. Mix sugar, flour and nutmeg together and add. Cook until thick, stirring constantly. When boiled about five minutes, remove from fire. Add vanilla and butter and serve hot. (The caramel sauce recipe was borrowed from Mrs. Charles Schultz, Jr.)
