## Week-Long Lutheran Evangelism Mission Starts Here on Oct. 30

Members and friends of First Lutheran Church, Carson and Flower, are making extensive plans for participation in the Lutheran Evangelism Area Mission, from Oct. 30 to Nov. 4. According to Rev. Paul Wenske, pastor, about 125 other Lutheran churches of the National Lutheran Council will carry on this program at that time.

This Area Mission will stress a three-fold emphasis—preaching, teaching and reaching. A guest minister will speak every evening from Sunday through Thursday at 8 p.m. In this series of messages, the pastor said, church members will be confronted with the claims of Christ and will seek to go deeper into His Word in order to go farther as His witnesses. Special music also will be a feature.

**Visitation Set**  
 During the week preceding the mission, every member and home of First Lutheran Church will be visited by teams of visitors, Rev. Wenske said, and members will be asked to support the mission and to manifest loyalty to Christ and His Church in every possible way. Each family will be urged to conduct a daily Bible and pray-

er period known as the "Family Altar."

In preparation for the Mission Week, cottage prayer meetings will be held in various areas in the homes of the members. Immediately preceding the mission there will be a 24-hour prayer vigil at the church.

During Mission Week teams of visitors from First Lutheran Church will call on unchurched people in this area.

**Church Invitation**  
 They will bring an invitation and encourage those outside the church to enroll in the pastor's adult classes, to have their children baptized, and to enroll them in the Sunday School.

The objective of the Mission is to win people for Christ and His Church. This is not only a one-week program, but part of a year round emphasis, Rev. Wenske stated.
