

Baptists to Hear About Crucifixion

"Crucified With Christ" will be the sermon topic of Rev. George E. Cain, pastor of the South Bay Baptist Church, 4565 Sharynne Lane, as he brings this message at the Sunday morning service at 11.

Following the message, new members will be received and the Lord's Supper observed. Junior church, crib nursery and

toddler care is provided during the same hour.

Special music at the evening service at 7:30 o'clock will be provided by Ben Cooper and the pastor will discuss, "Understanding Our Errors." The nursery will be open.

Capt. Hinds Participating In Maneuvers

Capt. Warren E. Hinds, son of Mr. and Mrs. Roy E. Hinds, 460 E. 214th St., is scheduled to take part in Exercise Sage Brush, the largest Army-Air Force maneuver since World War II.

Captain Hinds' unit, the 2nd Logistical Command at Fort Bragg, N.C., will operate as the 1st Field Army Support Brigade in the Louisiana exercise. The mission of the unit will be to provide logistical and administrative support.

Rev. Gangsei Organizes 2nd Church in Torrance

Although he has been an ordained minister for only 10 years, the Rev. Lyle B. Gangsei has organized two new churches in widely separated parts of the country.

But he is following in a family tradition. His father, also a Lutheran pastor, helped to organize churches before him.

The second of Rev. Gangsei's pastorates, at the Lutheran Church of the Resurrection, 330 Palos Verdes Blvd., has seen the congregation grow from a charter membership of 99 in 1951 to about 550 persons today. During the same period, the Concordia Lutheran School has grown from 25 to more than 400 enrollees today.

Called to Organize

Rev. Gangsei was called from the Church of the Good Shepherd, at Rockford, Ill., which he also helped to organize, to help form the local church in 1951. Because of his organization experience, he was called to Torrance by the Lutheran Home Mission Committee. With the aid of a parish worker, preparations were made for the church and the present two-acre site was picked.

The congregation at first met in the Redondo Seventh-Day Adventist Church, but later moved into their present building, which includes a chapel and classrooms for a six-grade school which is operated in conjunction with the church. Work is expected to start soon on another classroom unit, which will up the number of grades in the school from kindergarten through the eighth.

Sanctuary Planned

Included in future plans is a large sanctuary, also to be erected on church property, just south of present buildings.

I am a great believer in educating the church where the people are," Rev. Gangsei noted.

Two services are now held each Sunday at the church, and two Sunday School sessions, but the pastor anticipates that a third service will be added to accommodate new members within the next year.

Assistant Added

Rev. Gangsei is assisted in youth work and visitations by John Rockne, a 1955 graduate of Concordia Lutheran College. The church has three youth groups.

A men's club held an organizational meeting last week. It is expected to be a social group and a sponsor of youth and athletic events.

The son of a pastor, Rev. Gangsei was born in Minneapolis, Minn., but spent ten years in California, where his father helped to organize a church in Sacramento. The family then returned to live in Iowa; and Minnesota.

Planned to Teach

Originally planning to be a history teacher, Rev. Gangsei attended St. Olaf College at Northfield, Minn. While a senior, he decided to become a minister and received OT and BTh degrees from Luther Seminary of St. Paul, Minn.

He was ordained in 1945 and spent 16 months as a Navy chaplain, serving in Hawaii and Japan aboard the destroyer, USS Altair.

After getting out of the Navy, he spent a year as associate pastor at a church in Madison, Wis., and moved on to Rockford, Ill., where he helped to organize a new church.

Met Wife in School

He met his wife while both were students at St. Olaf College and the couple now have three sons—Paul and David, nine-year-old twins, and Peter, 8.

Stamp collecting, reading, and gardening are among Rev. Gangsei's spare-time activities. An avid tennis player, he is looking forward to the completion of the tennis courts at nearby El Retiro Park.

The church, Rev. Gangsei believes, offers an answer to the increasing problem of family break-ups. As the individual and family become Christian, he declares, the change becomes apparent with a resulting benefit to society.

Man, he believes is eternally troubled with three problems—where do we come from, why are we here, and where are we going?

"Man's relationship with God, through Jesus Christ gives us the answers," Rev. Gangsei believes. "Without Christ that question is unanswered."

Auto Parking Lights Not For Driving

"Many motorists are still driving with parking lights on during the early hours of darkness even though this practice has been illegal for more than a month," J. T. Blalock, president of the Greater Los Angeles Safety Council, said yesterday.

Purpose of changing the law governing the use of parking lights, Blalock said, was to make certain that motorists would not forget to turn on headlights at night driving.

The president of the local chapter of the National Safety Council said the new law prohibits the use of parking lights on any moving vehicle unless headlights are also in use. And with the early approach of darkness during fall and winter months, he reminded motorists that the Vehicle Code requires the use of headlights within a half-hour after sundown.

In addition to the parking light change, Blalock said a new law also requires that headlights be clearly discernible at a distance of 500 feet. Previous law required clear headlight visibility for only 200 feet.
