Nursery Bid For Hospital OK'd by Board
 Award of contract in the amount of \$135,376 to Kropff Construction Co. for major additions to the Obstetrical Ward and Premature Nursery at Harbor General Hospital was approved Tuesday by County Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

Chace said the construction which is scheduled to get under way within the next two to three weeks calls for the addition of two delivery rooms and other facilities for the care of premature infants to Ward E of the Harbor General Hospital.

There also will be isolation rooms for babies born with infectious disease as well as relatives' waiting rooms, the Supervisor announced.

Expansion of the existing floor space to meet the needs of present and future conditions and the installation of the necessary oxygen supplies and air conditioning for the wards will be included in the construction, Chace said. The completion of the new additions of the Harbor General Hospital will bring the Obstetrical Department of the institution up to the highest possible standards, the supervisor declared.

Collectors Are First Over Goal

Torrance Community Chest neighborhood volunteers, under the leadership of chairman Mrs. Betty Rowell, are the first residential unit in the harbor area to make 100 per cent of their Chest goal, Torrance campaign chairman Phil Lisman announced this week.

Although all money turned in since the neighborhood appeal began on Nov. 2 has not been tabulated and posted by campaign headquarters Lisman said that unofficial reports from Mrs. Rowell's seven division chairmen indicate the unit will top its Chest goal of \$4714 by "at least \$10 or \$15, and perhaps more."

Lisman reported collections in other Torrance Chest units as follows: Public employees,

\$497, 118 per cent of their goal of \$419; commerce and industry, \$3853, 56.36 per cent of the goal of \$6837; advance gifts, \$3100, or 59.04 per cent of the goal of \$5250, and business, \$819, 63.48 per cent of the \$1290 goal.

Mrs. Rowell and Torrance public employees chairman Mrs. Bernice Goodwin were given recognition by harbor area campaign chairman James Visceglia at the Associated Cities report luncheon held Tuesday at the Statler Hotel. Mrs. Goodwin, whose public employees division was both first unit in the harbor area and first public employees division in Los Angeles to top its Chest goal, was presented with an "Oscar" by associated cities chairman, Harold O. Chaney.
