BLACK AT EDUCATION CONFAB

James R. Black, of Hermosa Beach, will be one of 98 California representatives now attending the White House Conference on Education in Washington, D.C. The conference was instigated by President Eisenhower in his January State of the Union message.

Some 2000 delegates are attending the conference, which is meeting at the Sheraton-Park Hotel in the nation's capital. General chairman of the California delegation is Gardner Johnson, who headed the Governor's conference in Sacramento on Sept. 30 and Oct. 1.

Black, a member of the Board of Trustees of El Camino College, played a prominent role in the state conference, leading a section which discussed the question, "What Should Our Schools Accomplish?"

A former president of the El Camino board, Black was re-elected to a trustee position in May for a term which will extend until July, 1958. His four year service on the college board was preceded by 20 years as a member of the South Bay Union High School board.

Since 1941, Black has served as general traffic manager of the Pacific Telephone Co.; he has been affiliated with the firm since 1920, and is a member of the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce.

A graduate of the California Institute of Technology, the convention delegate served for several years as president of that institution's Alumni association.
