## CHRISTMAS SEAL SALE UNDER WAY

The sale of Christmas seals has begun in Torrance and will continue through Dec. 15, the Torrance and Lomita chairmen announced Friday.

Heading the drive locally are Mrs. Robert Chavez, 3730 175th St., north Torrance; Mr. Lee Stamps, 804 Acacia Ave., central Torrance; Mrs. E. M. Perkins, 5331 Linda Dr., south Torrance; and Mrs. Tony Pusich, 28460 Leesdale, Harbor City-Lomita.

Bing Crosby is honorary chairman of the traditional sale, for which a goal of \$780,000 has been set in Los Angeles County.

According to Gerald Rosen, county chairman, the health program of the Los Angeles County Tuberculosis and Health Assn. will extend itself in education, research, case-finding, and rehabilitation. No community is safe from disease until the entire health program is considered in perspective.

"The goal is high this year for our county," Rosen said, "partly because of the relaxed feeling that many of our citizens have regarding communicable disease.

Although the death rate dropped greatly with the development of drugs for TB cure, the number of cases has not, he said.

## Savings Firm Tells Assets

The Southwest Savings and Loan Assn., Torrance branch, had total assets of \$7,404,210 at the end of the third quarter of 1955, according to figures released by Manager Eldon J. Bowen yesterday.

As of Sept. 30, the Torrance office had recorded \$1,603,210 in first need of trust real estate loans during the preceding three months. The office also recorded \$3,800,000 in real estate loans since Jan. 1, predominantly upon property in this area. During the 18 months of operation here, \$5,325,130 in real estate loans has been recorded, Bowen said.

This figure represents about \$3,000,000 of investments and loan repayments to the local office and more than \$2,000,000 in funds from the Inglewood office.

Nearly all Torrance office savings investments, plus some funds from the main office have been loaned out locally, Bowen said.

"I attribute the success of our office to the good patronage of Torrance residents, who have shown their good faith by investing in savings accounts at our office, thus making loan funds available to the general public," Bowen said.

The local office is located at 1439 Marcellina Ave. The office currently pays 3 1/2 per cent interest per annum on savings accounts.

## Banks Cited For Aiding Bond Sales

Both Torrance banks were extended a formal thanks this week by the U. S. Treasury Dept. for their "leadership and patriotic services" in helping raise community investments in Savings Bonds during 1955 to a 10-year record high.

Recent local citations in special recognition of individual bank support were Dean L. Sears, manager of the Bank of America, and Art O. Otsea, vice president and manager of the California Bank here.

Presentation to the two Torrance banks was made by Clare E. Harp, area sales representative, in the name of the Secretary of the Treasury, George M. Humphrey.
