REV. CAIN WILL SPEAK ON SATAN

"Satan as an Angel of Light" will be the sermon topic of Rev. George F. Cain, pastor of the South Bay Baptist Church, 4565 Sharynne Lane, Sunday at the 11 a.m. worship service. Sacrament Is Lesson Topic This Sunday

Christian Scientists will kneel in silent communion with God to receive more of the "Christ spirit" at the Sunday service on "Sacrament" in all Christian Science churches. They will pray with the Psalmist (51:10), "Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me," which is the Golden Text of the Lesson-Sermon. A citation in the sermon from "Science and Health With Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy reads, "Our baptism is a purification from all error. Our church is built on the divine Principle, Love. We can unite with this church only as we are new-born of Spirit, as we reach the Life which is Truth and the Truth which is Life by bringing forth the fruits of Love—casting out error and healing the sick" (p. 35). A correlative passage from John's Gospel (21:17) relates that Jesus questioned Peter "the third time, Simon, son of Jonas, lovest thou me?" It continues, "Peter was grieved because he said until him the third time, Lovest thou me? And he said unto him, Lord, thou knowest all things; thou knowest that I love thee. Jesus saith unto him, 'Feed my sheep'."

Salvation Army Appeals for Aid To Flood Areas

The Salvation Army Men's Social Service Center serving this area has been designated by Salvation Army Territorial Headquarters in San Francisco as a Southern California collection center for food, clothing, and money for California flood sufferers. Brigadier William J. Parkins, manager of the center, said special telephone service has been established. A call to FA 1848-8163 will bring one of the center's fleet of 15 Red Shield trucks to collect contributions of local residents. All material will be processed and packed by workers at the center for immediate shipment to the flood-ravaged areas. "This is an extreme emergency," Brigadier Parkins said. "The Salvation Army, ever ready to serve when disaster strikes, will use every resource at its command to provide help for flood victims." He said Salvation Army can tent workers are on the scene and will remain as long as they are needed.

Bigelow, well-known horticulturist and landscape gardener, will conduct these classes, which are open to the public. Persons interested in talking the course may enroll the first night of the class at the school's indicated. Savings Firm Pays Record '55 Interest

Orville Welch, manager of American Savings & Loan Assn., announced Saturday that the association was paying the 66th uninterrupted interest payment to its investors, the highest in the history of the savings association. American Savings investors will receive interest payments for the second six months of 1955 totaling a record high of \$186,044. Welch pointed out that this was in addition to the \$145,000 paid on investment certificates in July of this year. "Investors of American Savings again will receive the high rate of 3 1/2 per cent interest per annum for the first six months of 1955," Welch stated. American Savings' interest rate was declared in advance for the first half of 1956 at a regular Board of Directors meeting this week. American Savings & Loan Assn maintains offices in Redondo Beach and Manhattan Beach.
