

Sergeant Cook Given Jaycee Service Award

Thomas in San Pedro

Assemblyman Vincent Thomas' office said today that he will be back in his San Pedro office part of this week following his attendance in recent days of the public transit hearings in Los Angeles.

He will meet here next Wednesday and Thursday with the legislature's interior committee on Fish and Game and will go to San Diego, Jan. 30 and 31 for a meeting of the legislature's joint committee on highways. The group also will meet Feb. 1 at Riverside.

Commissioners Split

Members of the City's Planning Commission split down the middle Wednesday night on a new petition by McDonald Brothers for a change of zone from residential and commercial at Carson St. and Orenshaw to M-1, light manufacturing.

Following a committee report by Commissioner John Mulvihill, who recommended the firm be permitted to use the strip along Carson St. for light manufacturing, with certain restrictions, the Commission voted 44 on the matter.

Favoring the development of a modern, light manufacturing center on the old Ideco property were Commissioners Bert Lynn, Beverly Smith, William A. Mason, and Mulvihill. Opposing the development were J. A. Beasley, David Figueroa, Thirvin Fleetwood, and E. S. Schoonover.

Nearly 1000 members of Southern California's 40th Armored Division this month will don the new-style stripes and eagle insignia of specialists in place of their present rank as non-commissioned officers.

Affected by changeover will be 987 administrative experts, craft specialists, mechanics, communications personnel and other technicians, members of the 40th's 111 Southern California units.

Youth Shoots Self


