

Mormon Choir to Sing Here Saturday

Soloists Named for Appearance

The Mormon Choir of Southern California, composed of 200 Southland singers, will perform this Saturday, Feb. 4, at 8 p.m. in the Torrance Civic Auditorium with Frederick Davis conducting.

Widely renowned in California and throughout the nation for their musical interpretations the choir will feature, among others, Delos Jewkes, bass.

The choir has appeared at six performances of Cinemasia including the premiere performance of "Cinerama Holiday." They sang at the Hollywood Bowl rally for President Eisenhower and have made recordings for both NBC and CBS.

The Mormon Choir was organized in 1951 to sing at the annual "Our America Program," held in Hollywood Bowl in October of that year.

The next appearance will be at the Wilshire Ebell Theater in concert on May 18.

Davis, the conductor, also leads the Los Angeles Male Chorus of the Ellis-Orpheus Club, and the Southern California Oratorio Society.

Assistant Conductor is William Gould, formerly on the music staff of USC as conductor of the USC band.
