Lesson-Sermon Topic Sunday Is On 'Soul'

God, the source of all reality, is seen as Soul in Christian Science. The subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Christian Science churches Sunday is "Soul."

The Golden Text from Leviticus (26:11,12) keynotes the theme, "I will set my tabernacle among you; and my soul shall not abhor you. And I will walk among you, and will be your God, and ye shall be my people."

The sermon is preached from the Holy Bible, and from "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by MARY BAKER EDDY. A passage from the latter reads, "When understanding changes the standpoints of life and intelligence from a material to a spiritual basis, we shall gain the reality of Life, the control of Soul over sense, and we shall perceive Christianity, or Truth, in its divine Principle" (p. 322).

This is correlated by a statement of the Apostle Paul to the Romans, "They that are after the flesh do mind the things of the flesh; but they that are after the Spirit (the things of the Spirit)" (Rom. 8:5).

1,250 Men Aided Daily

February will be Miserere House Month at the St. Vincent de Paul Salvage Bureau, it was announced by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. James E. Dolan, director. Proceeds from the salvage operation will go to the support and maintenance of the rehabilitation center for homeless, transient men at 231 Winston St., Msgr. Dolan reported.

James Francis Cardinal McIntyre opened the center a year ago to provide a clean, decent base of operations for men in the course of their rehabilitation. The center includes a shower, clothes cleansing, radio, television, letter-writing, newspapers, books, periodicals, cards, games, table tennis, counseling, employment and a chapel.

It is operated by the St. Vincent de Paul Society. Cost of operation is approximately \$2000 a month, Msgr. Dolan stated. Funds for this work are gained only through public donations. Men are attending Miserere House on an average of 1250 per day. It is estimated that more than 350,000 will have attended in its first year.

Facilities include shaving, showers, clothes cleansing, radio, television, letter-writing, newspapers, books, periodicals, cards, games, table tennis, counseling, employment and a chapel.
