### Volunteers for Children Raise Money for Project

A beautiful ceramic doll now on display at a downtown cosmetic shop in Torrance will be given as a door prize by members of the Volunteers for Children to raise money for their project, providing care for the children in the Harbor General Hospital. The doll was donated to the Volunteers. This group of local women play the role of "substitute" mother to these children and divert the child's attention away from his personal problems. As substitute mothers, the volunteers talk to the child, play with him, read to him, and generally add to his happiness and well-being. A specified four hours per month of a member's time

with her hospital children is the minimum requirement for active regular membership. However, a member may spend as many hours as she desires during the hours specified by the hospital. It is desired that each member try to spend one morning or one afternoon a week at the hospital with the children. Members are required to wear a uniform. There is also a small dues which covers the cost of the badges worn by members and the notices of the meetings.
