## Hahn Seeking 'Reasonable' Speed Limits

County Supervisor Kenneth Hahn Friday called for a study of speed limit regulations on major county roads and secondary highways with the object of making the speed limits more reasonable and practical.

In a letter to County Road Commissioner Sam R. Kennedy, the Supervisor pointed out that as a matter of fact, most traffic on major streets posted for 25 miles per hour travels at rates of 35-40 miles per hour.

"The average driver often technically violates the posted speed limits, but I believe that greater hazards and increased congestion would be caused if he tried to observe the posted speed when the flow of traffic is faster than the limit. Therefore, it is time that the speed regulations be made more reasonable," Supervisor Hahn declared.

He continued with the observation that "drivers don't like to violate the speed regulations, but often are forced to do it to keep up with the flow of traffic."
