

### 'Madonna Row' Display Tops El Camino's Season

With floodlights illuminating the paintings, Madonna Row of El Camino College is now presenting Southlanders a unique Christmas display for the eighth consecutive year. Rapidly gaining recognition throughout the Southland, the Row has a new addition this holiday season, a stained glass window, "The Blue Madonna of Chartres."

Miss Mildred Walker and Joseph S. Gadden, both of the art department, completed work on the stained glass project last week after devoting week-end time for the past six months. An estimated value of \$7200 has been placed on the window.

New Addition  
Aside from the latest addition, the Row features six reproductions of well-known Madonna paintings and a mosaic, "Madonna and Child," all 8 by 10 feet in size.

The mosaic, a masterpiece in itself, contains more than 24,000 pieces of tile and glass representing over 150 working hours by Miss Walker and members of her art classes. "Madonna and Child" was introduced to the Row in 1954.

The Row, which is located in front of the Administration building at 18007 S. Crenshaw Blvd., was lighted for the first time Dec. 10 and will continue to be illuminated for the benefit of late passers-by throughout the holiday season.

Paintings Added  
Madonna Row, originated through the efforts of Miss Walker in 1949, started with the Raphael painting, and has added one painting, aside from the mosaic and stained glass window, each year.

To complete the stained glass window, Miss Walker and Gadden used imported glass; all work was completed with campus facilities. Small pieces of stained glass were formed into a composite picture of the Madonna and Child and bonded together.

The other paintings include Raphael's "Madonna Tempe" of the Italian school, "The Virgin With Santa Ines and Santa Tecla" by El Greco of the Spanish Baroque school, "The Ince Hall Madonna" by Jan Van Eyck of the Flemish school, G. B. Piazzetta's "Virgin and Child," and Sandro Botticelli's "The Virgin With the Child."

Each in Gold Frame  
Each of the reproductions is placed in an attractive simulated gold frame by the college maintenance staff and then placed in the Row.

FCC include several charity drives, a party for employe children, Christmas carols featured on the college chimes, and a Christmas concert which was held last week.

Chi Gamma Iota, the veterans' fraternity on campus, sponsors a program to help the underprivileged boys at the downtown Los Angeles Junipero Serra Boys' Home. Veterans purchased 10 memberships in the YMCA for the youths last year and will renew them this season plus giving the boys recreational equipment.

All social and service clubs on campus are combining efforts during the holidays to assist needy families in the county by collecting food, toys in good repair, clothing and cash donations for shoes.

This marks the first Yuletide season that such a project has been undertaken by all organizations of the campus.

### SALES TAX RECEIPTS HIGHER FOR DECEMBER

The State Board of Equalization announced yesterday that distributions of local sales taxes which have been collected by the State since state administration of local taxes was inaugurated in April now amount to \$50,664,265.

The Board certified to Controller Robert C. Kirkwood the sum of \$21,639,608 for the December distribution to the 16 counties and 131 of their cities for which it has been collecting local sales taxes in the third quarter of the calendar year.

Included in this amount are third-quarter receipts from those taxpayers who report on a quarterly basis, September receipts from taxpayers who report on a monthly basis, and small amounts of delinquent or previously unallocated taxes for prior tax periods. Except for about \$325,000, which is being withheld pending further information from taxpayers, this completes the distribution of collections for the July-September quarter of 1956.

The current payment is the sixth to the seven counties and 71 cities which have utilized the program since its inception in April. By June 30, the end of the 1956-57 fiscal year, these jurisdictions may anticipate about twice as much local sales tax revenues as they have received to date.

The nine counties and 60 cities for which the State has been collecting local sales taxes since July are now receiving their third payment. By next June 30, they may look forward to about three times as much revenue as they have received to date. The initial payments to the eight counties and 43 cities whose state-administered taxes became effective on Oct. 1 will be made in January.

**L.A. Leads List**  
Two counties and six cities have now received more than one million dollars each in revenues under this program. The largest of these shares went to the City of Los Angeles, the County of Los Angeles, and the City of Oakland, which received \$7,080,578, \$2,073,428, and \$1,428,648, respectively, in the current distribution, and \$18,464,916, \$5,688,673, and \$1,557,808 to date. In addition, seven other cities have received more than half a million dollars to date under the program. The City of Torrance received \$88,372.56 in the current distribution and has received \$255,657.62 to date.

Each county which plans to contract for state administration of local sales taxes beginning April 1, 1957, must adopt the necessary ordinance on or before March 2. A city contract cannot be consummated until the county in which it is located has acted.
