Food Course Plans Made For the West

Plans for offering the course in food distribution in three additional areas of the country—the East, West, and South—were revealed this week by Milton E. Sandell, chairman of the board of the National Association of Food Chains. Currently, the course—the only one in the country to grant bachelor's and master's degrees in food distribution—is available only at Michigan State. Initial planning for the college training program sponsored by NAFC was based on the idea that Michigan State would serve as a "pilot school," Sandell said. Established in 1950, the course has grown during its six years of operation to the point where about 175 students are now enrolled. Demand for similar programs in other parts of the country led to the decision by the NAFC executive committee that the time had come to begin active investigation of other colleges and universities. A college training task committee has developed the criteria for selecting suitable schools to offer the course. Included on the committee are W. H. Dyer, Jr., Jim Dandy Markets, Merle McGinnis, Safeway Stores, Inc., and Lloyd W. Moseley, of the Grand Union Co., who is chairman.
