City May Lose Bid To Rezone Parking

(The following stories are taken from the complete stories published in the Sunday, Feb. 17th, edition of the HERALD.)

The city's move to zone all downtown parking lots to restrict them to parking only may have hit a legal snag this week in a ruling prepared by City Attorney Stanley Remelmeyer.

In a brief prepared for the Council meeting this week, Remelmeyer concluded that the proposed rezoning of the property to P-1 "is probably unconstitutional except as to those lots where a written approval is received from the owners."

Remelmeyer's ruling was made after the City Council and the planning commission had instituted action to change parking lots within the boundaries of the downtown assessment district to the special zone which would assure their future use as parking sites.

Early History Told
"Young people should learn all they can about such subjects as chemistry, physics, and mathematics," declared W. N. "Dick" Felker, pioneer Torrance industrialist whose genius made the Felker diamond saw world famous, in a talk Thursday night before the Rotary Club.

Bail System Probed
Charges that bail money posted with a privately hired warrant officer of the Torrance Police Department didn't reach the court were aired at an informal hearing Thursday afternoon. Testifying on the matter before Municipal Judge Otto B. Willett at South Bay Municipal Court were never posted.

Police Chief W. H. Haslam said the local department had no record of the matter, and that Gee had apparently never been paid a commission for serving the Los Angeles warrant. Gee said he turned the money over to Torrance police.

This week's development followed charges last summer that the warrant officer had been slow in depositing bail monies he collected. At that time, he canceled his contract, but the city retained him on a per diem basis after revising the method of handling the accounts. The case heard Thursday involved bail monies due prior to last year's reorganization.

Group Studies Park
A six-man committee was named to meet with Santa Fe officials in an effort to reach an agreement on additional land north of the present 27-acre civic center site at the conclusion of a three-hour hearing this week on the city's action in filing condemnation proceedings on 50 acres of the industrial property.

The appointment of the committee by Mayor Albert Izen climaxed a session which was

marked with charges of bias on the part of the mayor, and a threat to call for his ouster as mayor.

Named by the mayor to the committee were Herma Tillim, president of the parks and recreation commission; Bert Lynn, president of the planning commission; John J. Fitzgerald, 1327 Maple Ave., who had earlier presented a petition asking that the entire area between Maple Ave., Dominguez reservoir, Torrance Blvd., and Hawthorne Ave. be barred to industrial development; F. W. Mill, representing the Torrance Industries Tax Committee; A. E. Thompson, president of the Chamber of Commerce; and the mayor.
