### Special Report From YMCA Delegation in Sacramento

We had a wonderful trip up to Sacramento, seeing many beautiful sights along the way. One thing that made the trip especially nice was the ride in the 1957 Pontiac Station Wagon, loaned to us by the Twin Pontiac. It was raining on our arrival at the Capital City, but we quickly forgot the rain as we were received with committee meetings and group sessions.

Yesterday, our assembly bill to appropriate funds from gasoline taxes for drag strips to help juvenile delinquency failed to get out of committee, so our local delegation is backing a Marin County bill creating

drag strips from other state funds.

**An Active Session**  
We have been very active in both houses of State Legislature, supporting and fighting the many bills from all over our state.

We have voted to raise teachers pay in the Senate, but the bill faces a tough fight in the Assembly.

Two bills have gone through both the Senate, and Assembly and have been signed by the teen-age governor, Pat Partidge. Partidge signed a bill which would require California High Schools to provide "behind-the-wheel" driving courses to junior and seniors, and a bill which would waive sales tax for persons selling items to tax-supported schools.

**Controversy Seen**  
Shaping up as among the most controversial, is a bill which would require schools to teach courses in the basic components of world religion. The high point of the sessions was an address by Gov. Goodwin Knight, and, of course, the Governor's Ball, which was held Saturday evening.


