Alter Realty Announces Hugh Property Agreement

One of the longest lease agreements in the city's history has been signed by Alter Realty & Insurance Co. for a Torrance Blvd. corner—a lease agreement for 99 years and involving more than half a million dollars.

Announcement of the new agreement was made by Gerald L. Alter, president of the Torrance realty corporation, who executed the lease for his company after more than a year of negotiations.

The property, at the northwest corner of Amapola and Torrance Blvd., is owned by Dr. and Mrs. O. E. Fossum. Dr. Fossum, a retired dentist,

maintained offices in downtown Torrance for many years, and has a wide acquaintance among pioneer Torrance families.

Representing Alter in the year-long negotiations was Boris S. Woolley, while the firm of Armstrong, Mewborn, and Hitchcock represented the Fossums.

Alter Realty & Insurance was organized by Gerald L. Alter after he took over the real estate business started by his father, Leslie Alter, in 1939.

The firm now is incorporated, and has 10 offices and 50 salesmen in the Torrance area.
