



believed that it would be better to replace the building than rehabilitate it. According to estimates, rehabilitation would cost 78 per cent of the cost of replacing it. Lighting and heating are "completely inadequate," Waldrip said. "We would still have an old school," Hull said.

**Year's Disuse**  
Rehabilitation of the school would make it unusable for about a year while renovations were going on, he said.

Replacement of present substandard facilities—Fern, Perry, and the temporary buildings—would not reduce the total amount of new facilities which may be constructed under the state loan program, Waldrip reported.

Among Torrance applications for state loans are the new Calle Mayor, Yukon, Hamilton, Jefferson, Lincoln, Columbia, and Madison Schools and additions at Arlington, Hillside, Flavian, Sepulveda, Anza, Riviera, Walteria, Madrona, and Edison Schools. Fern School comes under the replacement classification.

After the announcement last week that Fern School might be torn down, the HERALD received many protests from former students at the school.

**Marion Ave. Access Road Under Study**

The problem of whether an access road to the new South High School should be placed at the end of Marion Ave. was discussed by the Torrance school board Tuesday night, but no decision was reached.

A group of residents, led by R. E. Schroeder, appeared again to protest placing a school entrance at the end of a dead end street. They claimed that such an entrance would create a hazard for children in the area and that such an entrance was not needed.

School officials estimated that some 600 children would be using the entrance if it were opened. A 30-foot driveway is planned south of Marion Ave., with a five-foot sidewalk alongside. Officials opined that the pedestrian and vehicle traffic should be separated for safety's sake.
