Evangelist Bates Will Preach at Baptist Church

Rev. Benny Bates, a 32-year-old evangelist from Los Angeles, who has led evangelistic meetings throughout America, is coming to the Crenshaw Baptist Church, 18749 Crenshaw Blvd., for special meetings from March 10 to 17. The services will begin nightly at 7:30 p.m.

Before entering the pastorate in 1953, Bates was in demand throughout the country as an evangelist, Bible conference speaker and youth rally speaker. His ministry has taken him into some of the largest churches in America, as well as many civic auditoriums.

Evangelist Bates has served as youth director, director of evangelism, director of radio and TV, vice moderator of his association, and at the time he left the pastorate, was moderator of the San Gabriel Valley Assn. of Southern Baptist Churches.

The local Baptist church where Evangelist Bates will speak is one of 50 churches in the Los Angeles Assn. of Southern Baptists which will be cooperating in this simultaneous revival.
