## California Bank to Give Scholarships

The formation of a California Bank Scholarship program with participation of six privately endowed schools in California was announced Tuesday by Frank L. King, president of the bank.

The announcement was made at a luncheon attended by representatives of the six participating schools. Present were Dr. George C. S. Benson, president, Claremont Men's College; the Very Rev. Charles S. Casassa, S.J., president, Loyola University of Los Angeles; Dr. Arthur G. Coons, president, Occidental College; Dr. E. Wilson Lyon, president, Pomona College; Don Carlson, assistant to the president, Stanford University; and Robert D. Fisher, financial vice president, University of Southern California.

The scholarships are designed to assist deserving young men in their junior and senior years who are planning to follow a business career, King said. Selection of the scholarship recipient rests with the participating school. The schools were chosen on the basis of the number of graduates presently employed by California Bank.

## Civil Defense Siren Test Set Here Tomorrow

Warning sirens of both Los Angeles County and Los Angeles City, along with those of many other jurisdictions within the region, will sound tomorrow morning at 10 a.m. in the regular monthly test.

The city's 216 two-tone attack warning sirens will follow their usual one-minute sound. Residents are asked to call the Office of Civil Defense at HOLLYWOOD 2-1271 if the siren in their neighborhood fails to sound during the test or does not shut off after the one-minute test period.

Los Angeles County's 25 warning sirens, all triggered by Sigalert, will follow the usual pattern of one minute of steady blast, one minute of silence, and one minute of warbling sound. Because of the electronic and mechanical systems of these sirens and three-phase test is necessary to be certain they are functioning properly.
