Two Artists Signed For Sunday Concert

Two internationally famous musicians will occupy the stage in joint concert with the Torrance Area Youth Band at their next program to be given in the Torrance Civic Auditorium Sunday afternoon, April 7, at 4 p.m.

Sigurd Rascher, America's leading saxophone virtuoso, will be featured on the first half of the concert with the youth band. He will perform the "Prelude and Giga" by Corelli and the "Adagio and Samba" by Whitney with band accompaniment. The Youth Band will play the "Washington Grays" march, "Italian in Algiers" overture, and the finale to the Symphony No. 4 in F minor by Tschaiikovsky.

Symphony Soloist
 Rascher has the distinction of being the only saxophonist to have appeared as soloist on that instrument with the New York and Boston Symphonies. He has stopped off in Los Angeles for a few days between engagements with the Honolulu and Portland Symphonies.

Julian Olevisky, violinist, will perform on the second half of the concert. Olevisky, according to the New York Herald Tribune, is "the most worthwhile of our younger violinists."

Only 24 years of age, Olevisky has already toured Europe and the United States appearing in recital and with some of the leading symphony orchestras.

For his Torrance engagement Olevisky will play the Sonatina in D Major by Schubert, the Concerto No. 2 in D minor by Wieniawski, Meditation by Glazounow, and the "Carmen" Fantasy by Bizet-Sarasate. This concert is the fourth in a series of concerts sponsored by the Youth Band-Artist Concerts Assn.

Admission is by season ticket; however, individual tickets for this concert may be purchased at the box office.

Bereneice Trenary Gets Award for Good Idea
