

The Political Front

Charles Edward Chapel, first-time Republican, has stated that he will oppose Senator Kuchel because he voted for the NATO status of Forces Treaty.

Francis H. Packard, billed as a "well known smog fighter," has announced his "consent" to enter the race for Supervisor of the Fifth Supervisorial District, a post now held by Roger Jessup. Packard, who lives in Pasadena, is chairman of the Citizens Anti-Smog Action Committee which has been critical of the Supervisors and their handling of the smog situation in Los Angeles County. Packard says smog can be eliminated quickly "once those charged with its control—the Board of Supervisors—do their job." He has stated that he would restrict new industries from building in the County as part of his program.

S. Ernest Boll, district attorney for Los Angeles County since May 8, 1951, has announced his candidacy for return to office in the June 5 primary elections. Boll is a native of California, born in Long Beach in 1904. He attended public schools in the Southland and was graduated from the University of Southern California Law School in 1927.

He entered the D.A.'s office in 1931 and has served continuously there except for two and one-half years he spent as a naval officer during World War II. He was appointed chief deputy in the office in 1945 and served in this capacity until the Board of Supervisors appointed him district attorney in 1951. He was elected to a four-year term in 1952.

Roll's candidacy has been endorsed by many of the Southland attorneys and leading civic workers. Senator Thomas H. Kuchel, a member of the United States Senate for three years, has announced that he will run for election to the office in June. A California Republican, Kuchel is taking a firm stand on the Eisenhower administration which he reports he has faithfully supported on matters of international affairs and foreign relations. These are the most important items before the American people in that they are concerned with the security of the nation. "I have compiled a record of service which is squarely before my fellow citizens of California," Kuchel stated. "On that record I am willing to be judged."
