Knight to Name Superior Court Judge for Year

Governor Knight announced this week that he planned to name someone within the next two weeks to fill the vacancy left with the resignation of Superior Court Judge Georgia P. Bullock.

Judge Bullock, the state's first woman jurist, retired from the bench on March 1 at the age of 77.

Knight said his appointment would serve for the rest of the year with the new judge elected to the post succeeding at the normal time.

Those seeking election to the Superior Court post at the deadline last week included Judge John A. Shidler of the South Bay Municipal Court.

Others filing include former Mayor Fletcher Bowron, Municipal Judge Joseph L. Call and Joseph Marchetti, Otto G. Lord, Superior Court commissioner, and Attorney Ralph M. Drummond, Edward Reiden, Ir D. Brett, Leo Fenster, and Maurice Gordon.

Unless the replacement named by Gov. Knight is among this list of candidates, he will not be able to enter his name on the ballot.
