## Philmont List Grows

More Junior Leaders and Senior Crew Leaders of the Harbor District of the Los Angeles Area Council, Boy Scouts of America will have the opportunity for training at Philmont Scout ranch in New Mexico this summer.

Each of the 53 Scout Troops and 28 Explorer Units may nominate its top boy, and Scout Troops with two or more Explorer Crews may nominate a Senior Crew Leader also. These boys and their leaders will then be invited to an "Appreciation Event" on April 28.

Training Chairman Bill Waldon says that in his District there will be two Junior Leaders, as there have been in the past, but that this year two Senior Crew Leaders will be selected for training on the fabulous 127,000 acre ranch.

**Teaching Ability**  
First requirement for both groups is the natural ability to teach Scouting skills to younger boys because this program is sponsored by the Sears, Roebuck Foundation to enrich the whole Los Angeles Area Council.

**Character, leadership and ability** go together in the boys who will be selected to go to the ranch which is located in the Kit Carson country where deer, elk, bear, buffalo and beavers share the mountain terrain with Hereford cattle, saddle horses and burros.

The boys are selected on the unit level according to strict requirements that are designed to produce leaders of the future, then 10 Junior Leaders and five Senior Crew Leaders will be chosen before the final selection of the "Top Two" in each classification.

**Part of Team**  
All of those selected will be a part of the training team which will plan a training conference for the district the week end of Sept. 21-23, and an Explorer training conference during September or October.

The Top Ten Junior Leaders will spend a week at Lake Arrowhead Scout Camps, and the Senior Crew Leaders will meet for a three day weekend at the Explorer Base at Cabrillo Beach for training and work in preparation for these conferences.
