


Tartars Take Trackfest; North High Third

Beverly Hills unleashed a relentless attack on three Saxon hurlers Thursday in downing North High, 17-3, on the Torrance Park turf. It was the fourth Pioneer League loss for the locals. They have two wins.

Sophomore Tony Treece, Bob Skinner and Ev Harris shelled out 16 hits to the Normans, who had their big hitting logs on.

Dave Weiner, ace right-hander, set down the Saxons with six hits.

Beverly scored in every inning, tallying three times in the first and once in the second to get all they needed. They got six big guns in the fourth inning on four singles, two walks and a pair of North High errors.

Al Bledsoe and Ray Grieshaber each blasted out two hits to lead Coach Del Nuzum's Saxons.

Tomorrow the locals travel to El Segundo for another league fray. The Saxons defeated the Eagles in their last outing. Game time is 3 p.m. with Ron Anderson likely to get the starting mound call for the locals.

Top Individual Records Posted

Torrance's Tartars had little trouble disposing of neighboring North High and Leuzinger in a three-way meet at wind-swept North High Friday, but all three schools had individual bests in the affair.

The Tartars got 88½ points to Leuzinger's 24 and the Saxons' 11½ in the Varsity going.

Big wins for the Tartars were Gary Cooke's 10 flat 100. Duane Cooke's win in the 120 lows and tie with Joe Rubco for first in the 70 highs, and Myron Schmidt's double in winning the 440 and tying for first in the high jump with teammate Harold Mathews.

Gary Cooke pulled up lame after the century dash and didn't enter his specialty, the 220.

Larry Denning got a first for the THS thinclads in the pole vault as he cleared 12 feet, and distancemen John Trenary and Len Ehlers also coasted in with wins for the Torrance Varsity. Ehlers took the 880 and Trenary won the mile.

Possibly the best mark of the Varsity competition was Tom Brown's 22.2 furlong. He was pressed by Dick Dawson but had enough to finish ahead.

Leuzinger trounced both Torrance and North High in the Bee and Cee events.

Top marks in the Bee going included Saxon Gene Dalmier's 12-foot pole vault; Tom Holmes' 20" broad jump for Torrance, and George Boscon's 10.4 100-yard dash win for the Tartars.

Coach Willard Morgan was enthusiastic over the showing of his four Cee high jumpers. Gil Garnica leaped over the bar at 5'10" to easily win the event. In fact Garnica, Brent Scott, who was second, and NHS jumpers Bill Bubinski and Tom Espinosa all equalled or surpassed the winning Varsity height of 5'4".

At LaHabra
Scott cleared 5'5" while Bubinski and Espinosa topped 5'4".

Dave Campbell, who got thirds in the 100 and mile, led the Saxon Varsity performers.

Tomorrow Morgan takes his thinclads to LaHabra for a final practice tune-up before league prelims begin Friday. North High will meet with other Pioneer League schools Friday at Culver City for pre-
