

# EL CAMINO WILL PRESENT 'BRIGADOON' NEXT MONTH

"Brigadoon," El Camino College's ninth annual spring musical, will premiere in the Campus theater May 10, with a cast of 60. Meri F. Sloan, director of student personnel, said recently. Sponsored jointly by the college theater arts classes and the music department, this year's musical will be the biggest production attempted in the history of the show. Hamilton Maddaford, orchestral conductor and business manager for "Brigadoon," said. "Although casting is not complete," according to announcement of Dr. R. Gordon Orme, "the principal party have been cast and are fairly well determined at this time." Dr. Orme is vocal coach, music director, and joint director of the show with Maddaford.

From 1928 until 1929 he acted as secretary and manager of the Los Angeles Stock Exchange.

**Chemical Firms Encourage More Career Students**

Faced with a critical shortage of trained personnel, 800 Southern California chemical companies are joining in an intensive program to encourage high school boys and girls to seek a career in chemistry.

Dan W. Ryan, Dow Chemical Co., Torrance chairman for the program, announced yesterday that the effort has been started during Chemical Progress Week, April 23-25.

Los Angeles city and county schools including Pasadena, Long Beach, Glendale, Burbank, Santa Monica and other Southern California communities, are cooperating in the program.

"Last year the chemical industry could have used 3500 more chemists and chemical engineers than were graduated from American colleges and universities," Ryan says. "Some graduates were offered jobs by as many as 16 different companies."

Schools are distributing career booklets to chemistry students and some are showing motion pictures in classrooms. Leaders in the chemical industry also are making available time to visit schools for talks to chemistry classes and interviews with students.

Chemical companies throughout the country are offering literally thousands of fellowships and scholarships to finance education and grants-in-aid to universities to further encourage research. One company alone offers 500 scholarships, some at universities in Southern California.
