## Lesson-Sermon Topic Sunday On Fallen Man

Paul's declaration (I Cor. 15:22), "As in Adam all die, even so in Christ shall all be made alive," and the office of the Christ, stressing man's God-given sonship with the Father are highlighted in the Lesson-Sermon, "Adam and Fallen Man," read in the edifices of the Churches of Christ, Science and Health, on Sunday. The Golden Text expresses it, "If by one man's offence death reigned by one; much more they which receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness shall reign in life by one, Jesus Christ" (Romans 5:17).

This passage is correlated by a text from "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy: "When it is learned that the spiritual sense, and not the material, conveys the impressions of mind to man, then being will be understood and found to be harmonious" (p. 214).

## Teacher Will Give Speech On Humanism

"Humanism and the Feast of Unreason" is the title of a free public lecture to be given by Mr. Kenneth S. Brown at 8:15 p.m. tomorrow at the Highland Hills School, 2140 N. Highland Ave., Hollywood. Sponsored by the Hollywood Chapter of the American Humanist Assn., Yellow Springs, Ohio; Brown was formerly National Group Organizer and Counselor of the AHA and has addressed audiences throughout the U.S. in behalf of that organization. He is now a teacher in Torrance and lives at 64 Manhattan Ave., Manhattan Beach.

Brown defines humanism as being "a satisfying philosophy of life or religion which suggests that men employ science, reason, and brotherhood as their quest for fulfillment during this one life of which we are certain." "Most humanists are agnostics," he continues. "But that is a part of the humanist philosophy which is sometimes over-accentuated in importance. The humanist also has faith—but his faith is in man."

The AHA stands for separation of church and state, for civil liberties, planned parenthood, and the improvement of school and other public institutions. It is opposed to both totalitarian politics and authoritarian religion. Dr. Julian Huxley, English humanist and former UNESCO director-general, spoke in Los Angeles for the AHA a year ago.


