Hollywood Park Improves Plant For Turf Meet

When Hollywood Park opens its 17th meeting next Friday, racing fans will find that the directors and management have continued their never-ending program of improvements along many lines.

In addition to the complete annual renovation of the plant there will be new dual escalators at the Clubhouse entrance, standing ramps in both Grandstand and Clubhouse, odds boards in Clubhouse garden terrace and in Grandstand garden areas and a special depot for all buses adjacent to the main Grandstand - Clubhouse entrance.

On the back side, all barns have been renovated and repainted where necessary, streets have been re-graded and sanded, the tree planting program expanded and the racing secretary's office enlarged for the convenience of horsemen.

Principal Turf Club improvement is the enlargement of the dining area.

Clubhouse patrons will find most of the major improvements. The entrance has been re-designed and the new escalators will take patrons from the ground level up to the main line floor. From there escalators operate to the garden terrace, the new standing ramps is above and in front of the garden terrace and adjacent to the private Turf Club.

Hearing Today On Southland Deer Seasons

A public hearing to consider a proposed 1956 special archery, either-sex deer season in Los Angeles County similar to that of last year, and a proposal to permit the taking of deer of either sex during the last three days of the Coastal deer season in Southern California will be held in Los Angeles today by California's Fish and Game Commission.

The hearing will open at 10 a.m. in room 709 of the California State Building, 217 W. 1st St., with Commissioner Andy Kelly serving as hearing officer.

First proposal to be heard is for a special archery deer season in a portion of Los Angeles County, July 21 through Dec. 31, with a bag and possession limit of two deer of either sex.

The other proposal is for the taking of deer of either sex during the last three days of the regular deer season in San Diego, Orange, Los Angeles, Ventura and Santa Barbara Counties and the extreme western portion of Riverside County.
