**JC's Teen-Age Road-e-O Set**

Plans to hold a Teen-Age Road-e-O next Saturday, 11 a.m. in the parking lot at the rear of the Torrance High School, were announced last week by the local Junior Chamber of Commerce.

Any teen-age boy or girl who not have reached 20 years of age by next August 10, who has a driver's license or permit, and who has a clean record of no moving traffic violations in the past six months, may enter the Teen-Age Road-e-O.

Activities in the Road-e-O are conducted at three levels; the community level, consisting of a written test on driving knowledge and a performance test in four obstacle-type exercises; the state level, with a written test of driving knowledge; a performance test in four obstacle-type exercises, and a road-check for in-traffic performance; and the national level, with a written test of driving knowledge; a performance test, a driving attitude scale, a psycho-physical examination, and a personal interview.
